From Hilary:

Dear Church Family and Friends,

We have now achieved two Wednesday morning communion services in St Mary's, Gamlingay which have shown us the limitations of our internet connections there but have been appreciated by the people who attended. The first week was not good for those at home; this time was a little better. We will be doing the same next week. Do join on zoom if you can so that we can test the system with a larger 'on-line' congregation. A try-out in Everton is planned for this week.

The intention is to broadcast services from all the churches once we return to regular use of the buildings in September - that is assuming we are able to return as planned on the 20th and that we can sort out the necessary technology. We need people in both churches to help us operate the technology once it is set up, so do get in touch if you are such a person, or you know someone else who might help. Nick is doing a great job but won't be able to cover every service every week.

It amazes me how exhausting the two Wednesday services have felt. I hope it gets easier as we all become more familiar with procedure. Possibly after a break and with cooler Autumn weather things may also feel more comfortable. However, we will all be seeking to 'keep our balance' in times of change and uncertainty. I pray that we can keep our sense of proportion and keep up kindly connections as the People of God - it will not be all plain sailing as pressures fluctuate. Please do give me the benefit of the doubt when you think I might be behaving less than perfectly and I will try and do the same for everyone else.

I am looking for feedback on my use of a mask when leading worship. The requirement is clear for the congregation (unless various criteria apply to any individual) however it is less clear for anyone presiding at the service (distanced 5 metres or more) so it is important to me to know what you think.

Sound System

Since my arrival 2 years ago Tony Caudle, now moved from the village, has been enormously generous with his time and expertise in supporting the sound system at Gamlingay. The system is many years old and needs attention. Tony's move has coincided with our being excluded from church buildings. However, now we are back we find that what previously might have been thought a luxury in our rural setting, has become something of a requirement so we are most grateful for the visit this week of a professional sound engineer, friend of one our church members, who will be kindly advising us concerning the provision of technical support for our worship and other building-based activities into the coming years.
