Church Services into January

We are facing Lockdown under a new name (Tier 4) as we go into the New Year. The difference is that it is permitted to attend public worship (at the same time as being told to stay at home, not to socialise indoors and many public venues are closed). This leaves us with a dilemma as it is up to those running the church to decide what is safe and ensure safe practices when many of those involved are vulnerable themselves.

Gamlingay Church remains open daily for private prayer. Please contact me if it would be helpful for Everton Church to be similarly open. We will keep public service provision under review but at the moment the intention is, within the limits of technology, to offer all worship via Zoom and from all the churches in our Benefice on at least some occasions.

We (Wardens and worship leaders) are doing our best and rely very much on people making their own decisions on what they feel is safe for themselves and for their fellow-worshippers. **This Sunday** the service is at 9.30am in Gamlingay Church, open to attendance in person but designed for Zoom, so the sound will be via the computer and through the sound system - all being well!

It would be helpful to know if people intend to be present in person - email best, phone call also accepted. Covid safety rules apply - distancing, hand hygiene and face coverings all required.

For the time being there continues to be said communion service on Wednesdays at Gamlingay at 9.30am. This service is also available live on Zoom.

Our grateful thanks to Cindy who arranged for Santa Claus to tour Gamlingay and collect for us and the Baptist Church. As noted above, a sum of £122 has been donated to our roof fund.

As Ian wrote last time, we have ended this year several thousand pounds short of our Share payment. If we can pay the balance by the end of January we earn a discount on next year's payment, so it would be helpful to be able to do this. If you have the means to make a 'bridge the gap' donation, please do - the bank details are at the end of this Newsletter. Gamlingay pays by far the largest part of the Benefice share and is responsible for Hatley St George Church as well as St Mary's in Gamlingay. In these troubled times, when many are struggling to make ends meet, the Diocese still has stipends and housing costs to pay from the Share. A Parish Audit is taking place in January across the Diocese and it would be helpful, for future staffing considerations, to be seen to be paying our way at this time.

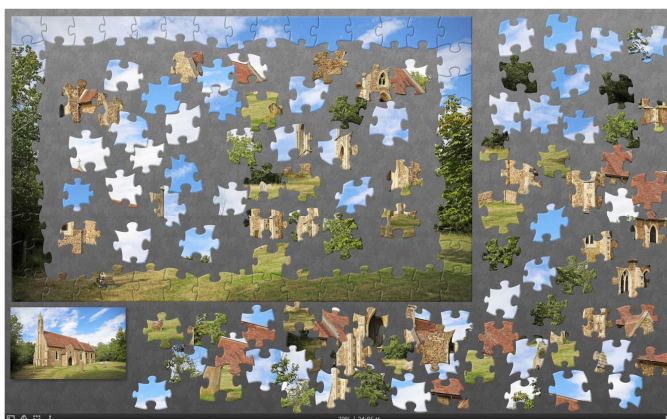
Peter Mann has sent us a “bit of fun for a chilly or wet afternoon”!
