BEECH TREE

As many of you will be aware, one of the beech trees in the churchyard has lost one of its branches. The Parish Council (responsible for the upkeep of the closed churchyard) and the Diocese have been consulted and the latest news is that Chris Smith has very kindly offered to remove the fallen branch which will be done tomorrow (Saturday). This extremely generous offer (which is free of charge) has been accepted by the Parish Council. As you will see from the photographs, this branch is of a significant size. The Parish Council has had the tree surveyed and the prognosis is not good. Sadly, the tree has Beech Bark Disease which will eventually kill the tree. It was a combination of this disease, a failed cable and a compression union at the point of attachment that caused the branch to come down. The Parish Council will decide what is to be done at its next meeting. If the tree were to be retained possible courses of action include a climbing inspection, replacement of cables which are already in place, removal of major deadwood and reduction of branches escaping the shape of the crown spread. Also, there would be no further public access to below the crown spread of the tree.
