As we celebrate All Saints, marking the end of the long season after Trinity and heading towards Advent, thoughts have already been directed towards Christmas. We do so long for the services we have been used to and it is so hard, once again, to be uncertain about whether our plans will work out as we continue trying to keep one another safe.

So, as the secular world will be concentrating on Halloween, let us make this Sunday a time to remember the unseen 'cloud of witnesses' with whom we travel on our journey home to God, and to celebrate the light that shines in darkness. Let us not be fearful when we see and feel darkness gathering but remember ourselves deeply loved by and precious to the one who has shared this earthly struggle and accompanies us always, whether recognised or not.

This Sunday the main morning service is an All Saints Eucharist for the whole Benefice to be held at Everton. Due to rising Covid cases, and therefore a possible issue with lifts, there will be a said 8am Eucharist at Gamlingay which is additional to the original plan. The Light party at Gamlingay is open to all. Do get in touch with Sarah or Sandra to be counted in - there will be a buffet, pumpkin trail and games and crafts for the season.

#### **Memorial Service**

The Annual Memorial Service this year will be on Monday November 1st at Gamlingay. There will also be an opportunity to remember the departed at the Evensong at Everton on 7th November. There will be many people remembering loved ones this year and my thoughts and prayers are with all.

## A Picture for Remembrance....

This is one of the last pictures which Hilary's sister, Marcelle, painted during remission from Melanoma from which she died a very few months later.

This was a commission for Remembrance tide (All Saints, All Souls and Remembrance Sunday) in Covid year 2020, when so many people said 'Good bye' under restricted circumstances.

Although intended to stand on its own, and not be overtly 'Religious' the picture is full of symbolism and expresses Marcelle's faith. Here are her notes:

gateway – departure from earthly life dove – spirit, peace, calm, grace

rose (dark crimson) - mourning

poppy - consolation (remembrance)

pansy - thoughts, remembrance

zinnia (yellow) - daily remembrance

sweet pea - goodbye, departure

marigold - pain and grief

lady's mantle - comfort

salvia (blue) - I think of you

rosemary - remembrance

fern – sincerity

There's a raindrop on one alchemilla leaf - a tear?

Some grass- like lines towards the bottom of the candle look a bit like barbed wire - alluding to war, therefore Remembrance Day

The brighter stripe across the candle could be seen as a ribbon - the yellow ribbon has begun to be used for home-coming and particularly in the US for the safe return of soldiers from conflict.

The pattern of foliage over and through the other objects, together with the diagonal across the candle echo the watercolour: 'After the First Frosts' - an elegiac theme of the passing of summer, but not without hope as there is still beauty in winter and, with the cycle of the seasons, spring will surely follow.
