#### **From Hilary**

We have celebrated All Saints and marked All Souls this last week (in both cases a day early). The Benefice service in the morning at Everton welcomed several congregation members from Gamlingay and the choir was a great blessing.



The All Saints Light Party and Service of Light that afternoon was another excellent occasion. The 'holy pumpkin lanterns' adorned the church porch for several days before being taken to compost - apart from the Rectory one which was taken early to dismember for soup!



And now we are in the Kingdom season (red colours in church). This time offers the opportunity to reflect on what it means to be a citizen of the Kingdom of Heaven as we count down to Advent.

There will be some serious discussions on how we manage worship in our Benefice as the church in Gamlingay will be out of use for a number of weeks, possibly including Christmas itself.

#### **Gamlingay Church Building**

The Good News is that the long-awaited project was launched this week, as news was released of the large National Churches Trust grant which means the work can now commence. This will enable replacement of the stolen lead from the roof, plus completion of other urgent repairs identified in the quinquennial inspection, particularly to the remaining lead roof and several of the windows.

The challenge which that news brings (some might call it 'the bad news') is that the work is on a rather larger scale than had been anticipated and must be completed in what has now become a rather tight timescale due to the grant schedule. To qualify for the grant, work could not be started before the grant was awarded and now must be completed by the end of March 2022. To be confident of achieving this, work is scheduled to start on November 15th to run for (it is hoped only) 20 weeks, during which time the church building will be unusable when work is taking place.

At weekends the chancel may well be available, but not the organ which will be wrapped for protection. Once protection for that and other woodwork in church is in place, the taking down and setting up of all of that would be required if the church were to be reinstated for use (not to mention the cleaning work involved) would cost too much time and money to be feasible on a weekly basis. This means a lot of re-planning. Fortunately, we can just manage to fit in the civic service for Remembrance the day before work starts but there is no question that, after that, usual patterns will be disrupted.

However, it is the price we must pay for the finances to enable us to be good stewards of the church building which previous generations have bequeathed to us. May we continue to be "The Body of Christ' - the living church, built of people - while our physical building is being repaired.

**NB**: This is 'new news' as I write and the PCCs and Wardens will have a lot to decide in the next couple of weeks. Please understand that things have had to move fast, and those involved are working flat out to get everything done in order of urgency. There will be more news as it becomes available - watch this space!

#### **Remembrance Sunday 14th November**

The church gatherings in both parishes will go ahead as previously planned, but at Gamlingay numbers may be restricted. Those planning to attend should let Hilary or one of the Wardens know.

In both churches everyone is asked to wear a face covering inside the buildings, unless exempt from doing so.



There are still some of the candles available. Let Hilary know if you would like one, they will be available in church on Sunday.

A reminder - they have cost £2.50 each and are offered for £3 or more donation to church funds of the church of your choice.
