A collection was made for next year's effort, the lights came on, on cue, at The Jannah, with 'snow' and canon-powered snow flakes - a good time was had by all. Well done.





This weekend sees a great deal of effort and planning, all done at short notice, come together. 'Thank you' and 'well done' to everyone who has worked so hard, we hope and pray this will raise the needed funds for this parish. There is still time to contribute to the draw - there will be tickets on sale at the event on Saturday, but they can also be obtained from Alec Hissett. Donations for the stalls, as in last week's Newsletter, can still be offered too.

Treasurer's Report

2021 has been another challenging year for most of us, in one way or another. At the time of writing, I'm at home self-isolating after having tested positive for Covid, with mild symptoms yet unable to do many of the things I would have liked to have been doing in the following 10 days. The PCC finances started the year under Covid restrictions, limiting our ability to hold fund raising activities. Yet, as the year progressed and the restrictions were lifted and thanks to the efforts of the organisers and all those involved, the PCC income through fundraising reached over £4,300 to date, with our biggest yet fund raiser on the horizon for this weekend.

Our greatest challenge, however, was meeting the Ministry Share Contributions for 2021. Whilst in previous years the PCC has always managed to fulfil its contributions, this time we had to reach for most of our reserves in order to do so. This leaves the PCC accounts in a rather delicate position as it relies on the generous donations from individuals and fund-raising fruits from the Xmas fair, to rebuild reserves for 2022. Hilary and Chris Miller are circulating a letter to our PCC electorate with reference to our finances in the new year, in an effort to raise the awareness and encouraging those who can give to do so generously.

As for the roof works, I wanted to mention the enormous efforts of Friends of St Mary's who managed to raise £85,000, which is made up of generous donations from local benefactors. This will accommodate for any cash flow issues at this early stage whilst we make our initial fund submission to the National Churches Trust, from who we will receive a grant of over £200K. Our first monitoring report from the surveyors has shown no unexpected costs at this early stage, in line with schedule. We are however duly reminded that it is still early days.
