From Hilary...

This Sunday is the last one before Lent begins, this coming week, on Ash Wednesday. If you have a palm cross you would like to add to the ones already collected to be used to make ash this year, do bring it to church on Sunday. New palm crosses will be distributed from Palm Sunday services at the beginning of Holy Week, when Lent finishes.

Lent Together

Lent is a season for personal growth, both for individuals and for the Church as a community to grow in relationship with God and one another. There are opportunities to be with others beyond Church services as follows:

Lent Lunches 12.30pm - 2pm drop-in at the Vicarage - a simple lunch provided, with donations to be shared between our Lent charity collection and Niassa. The first one is on Monday 27th February.

Study times

Monday afternoons 2 - 3pm, discussing daily Lent Reflections - Face to face and Zoom. Thursday evenings 7.30pm, discussing what it is to be a Christian - Face to face and Zoom.

Session 1 for Thursdays starts on 23rd February at 7.30pm

Session 1 for Mondays starts on 27th February after the first Lent Lunch. We will be looking back at the section between Ash Wednesday and Monday 27th which concentrates on the Morning Prayer readings from Jeremiah. Israel is being challenged by the prophet in her faithlessness and disloyalty. We too are called to reflect on the ways we 'miss the mark' in following God's call to right living.

For those wishing to follow the Lent Reflections booklets there are 5 copies to borrow or buy (£5 each) - ask Hilary. The booklets provide the Lectionary Morning Prayer readings, and a reflection on one of the readings for each day of Lent. There are introductory pieces on Lent, building daily prayer into life, and the method of meditating on Scripture called Lectio Divina (Holy Reading). The booklet also has formats for Morning Prayer and Compline (Night Prayer). Each Monday we will share what we have (or have not!) got out of the daily reflections for the past few days.

On Thursdays we shall be focusing on aspects of our faith, in the light of Lent themes around those chosen by Amy Scott Robinsons in her book 'Images of Grace'. Week one explores images of sin and repentance, and we will be thinking about what the Bible is, how we read it, and what prayer is.

As previously suggested and following Dawn's information last week, with no counter-suggestions, we shall be supporting Niassa with our Lent collections this year.
