In the midst of Lent, we come this week to Refreshment (Mothering) Sunday with its themes of thanksgiving for nurture and celebration. Monday's celebration of St Joseph - earthly father to Jesus - reminds us that the care and nurture for which we are thankful is not only from mothers, although of course they play an enormously important part. Mothering Sunday rightly honours mothers, but the celebration is much deeper and richer than cards and presents for Mums. If we use it rightly, it takes us into both the joy and the grief of caring and nurture in all its forms, including acknowledgment of when it can fail, as we remember the nurturing love of God which we receive in so many ways.

Next week there will be more detail on Holy Week and Easter services. There is an option to 'do' Holy Saturday differently from our previous pattern, as we have two candidates for the confirmation in the cathedral scheduled for that evening. Talk to me on Sunday if you have interest in this service in which we renew Baptism vows and anticipate Easter, bringing in the Light of Christ with the new Easter candle.

Next week's newsletter will also carry a financial update for both the Benefice parishes. In these times of rising inflation and higher fuel costs, all churches are needing to be thinking ahead now in order to meet obligations through 2023. This is not a cause for anxiety but a reason to ask, 'what is God doing and asking of us in this situation'?

They were a sociable and active couple in their time - Joan used to ride over to the RSPB at Sandy on her moped. With no children of their own, neighbours Mel and Graham Hughes who lived nearby on School Close were 'family' for many years. They live now in Great Paxton but continued to support Joan. Joan had been in a Care Home in Sandy for the last 3 years and was somewhat reclusive after Roy's death, so many will not have known her. However, all are welcome to her funeral and the refreshments afterwards.

NEWS FROM EVERTON

The APCM on Sunday 12th took place over lunch. **Thank you** and well done to those who prepared the food, which was plentiful and delicious.

The meeting received a draft report on the year, tabled at the meeting, including a summary of accounts. The final version of the report will be circulated to the Electoral Roll. The meeting approved what was received and some helpful suggestions were made for the coming year. In particular, a useful discussion took place on what shape the church at Everton can take into the future, acknowledging need for change to 'do what we can and not try to do what we can't'. The plan is to work with non-PCC members with short meetings after church, but also to come together soon for an extended planning time with an external facilitator.

Elections and Appointments were made as required by law. The same people were elected to the PCC as for 2022, and Everton continues without a Church Warden.

The apparent significant deficit for the year was due to works to the church, including the clock. These were partly paid from monies carried over from 2021. Otherwise, income fairly well matched expenditure, which is an excellent achievement.

Mothering Sunday service will be Evensong at 4pm, Posies will be available from the open church in the morning. Thank you to Jane Butcher for facilitating this.

Soup and Social goes from strength to strength - this week the new front fence was officially opened by Ward Councillors Tracey Wye and partner Adam Zerney alongside the usual lunch with delicious soups, bread and pastries from Tesco and local bakery. The two independent Councillors gave time to listen to local concerns as well as enjoying the social event.
