From Hilary...

This weekend sees the last Sunday of the Easter season before Ascension Day next Thursday. Although Ascension used to be one of the 'essentials' for Anglican Christians to attend, the festival itself gets a bit lost now coming, as it does, midweek. It nevertheless marks an important part of the Christian faith - the risen Jesus does not stay with those first disciples in bodily form. For our celebrations on Thursday, the location of the evening service depends on the availability of support personnel. Morning Prayer for Ascension will be in whichever parish church (Everton or Gamlingay) that does not have the evening service. It will be wonderful to share this so do try to join in with one of the services - locations will be advertised this Sunday. If that doesn't work out, the Sunday services after Ascension will continue the theme. Even if you can't be in church on the day itself, do take the opportunity to take part in a worldwide prayer season between Ascension and Pentecost (Whitsun) - I have one or two booklets designed to support this which I will leave in the churches on Sunday as we pray 'Thy Kingdom Come'. This is very appropriate as we have just celebrated an earthly King's Coronation with reminders of the Kingdom to which Jesus Christ offers entry and to which the King of England pledges service and is anointed into. Even without the booklets, you can join in by naming 5 people you will specifically pray for daily during this season. The prayer is for each of these people to come to know the love and peace of God in Jesus Christ.
