Local Singing Events 2023

There are two Evensongs locally in which singers are invited to participate. They are both of the "Bring and Sing" style which involves a rehearsal prior to the event and singing at Evensong itself.

- 1. Sunday 11 June at 6.00pm at St Neots Parish Church. There is a rehearsal at 4.00pm. Music includes:
 - Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis by Grayston Ives
 - Ayleward responses
 - Anthem, Let all Mortal Flesh by Edward Bairstow

The conductor is Ralph Woodward (who, as well as being organist of St Ben'e'ts, directs the Fairhaven Singers, and is in his second year of being Acting Assistant Director at Kings College).

The music is an RSCM publication "King of Glory, King of Peace". These are available for purchase from the Royal School of Church Music or, alternatively, Gamlingay Church has copies which are available for loan.

There is a fee of £5 (£6 for non RSCM members – the Benefice is affiliated to the RSCM with a group membership). This information is not only for existing choir members but for anybody else who feels that they might like to sing.

- 2. Sunday 16 July at 6.00pm at St Andrew's Church Biggleswade. There is a rehearsal on Friday 14 July at St Andrew's at 7.30pm. There will also be a run through on the day at 5.00pm. Music includes:
 - Locus Iste by Bruckner
 - Smith 5-part responses
 - Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis in B flat by Stanford
 - Anthem, Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ by SS Wesley

The conductor is Tim Croot, the choirmaster of St George's Letchworth and the organist is Justin Waters FRCO. The invitation to attend this Evensong is for members of the Benefice Choir. The Benefice Choir will be holding rehearsals for both these events during June and anybody interested in singing is welcome to attend these rehearsals.
