From Hilary:

What a triumph the Flower Festivals have been, as well as Gamlingay's Summer Fete! Well done to everyone who took part across the Benefice. One of the great things about the whole weekend, and preparations for it, was the way in which whole villages were included and everyone worked together. It was lovely to have something in all our churches on the same day. It did mean I was dividing my attention, and many of the participants didn't have the opportunity to see what was done in the other churches, but for visitors able to 'do the rounds' and for me, it was a real treat to be part of the power of stories as interpreted in each place. We all have our stories to tell, and it was lovely to give a platform for that. There are reports and pictures separately on the festivals elsewhere, and it is invidious for me to try and name everyone but know, all of you, how much you are appreciated for what you have done. Special mention has to be made of Jane Orchiston and Anne Clarke in Gamlingay and Sue Alexander in Everton for their pivotal roles - they will be the first to say it's not all down to them, but they have held things together and helped us all to produce something to be proud of. People were working in the churches for hours preparing displays and/or supporting others to do that, and in Gamlingay there was the Summer Fete to add in - I know in the heat and with all that needed doing there are some very tired people out there, but I hope it has felt worth it. It certainly seemed so to me, both in financial and in other terms. Again, WELL DONE and THANK YOU everyone.

Rest in Peace two previously central characters from our communities. Both in their 90s and having no longer lived in our villages in the last few years, it is a tribute to these people and to the communities that valued them that so many remembered them and shared in their 'farewells'.

- **Ishbel Beaty** whose ashes were interred at East Hatley on Saturday, will be missed by many her life has touched. Friends and family, some of whom could not attend the funeral, gathered to honour Ishbel's memory in a simple graveside ceremony at St Denis' churchyard in East Hatley on a beautiful sunny early afternoon. Ishbel's ashes were scattered into the grave of her friend as butterflies danced among the meadow flowers and grasses in this nature reserve. She was a special lady by all accounts, and although at 92 she had had a good innings, her contributions to the understanding of local history and in many other ways will be valuable well beyond her lifetime.
- **Terry Read** whose funeral took place this last week was a Gamlingay resident in later life and shared the life of the church there but was also, with his partner Tom, remembered by older inhabitants at Gransden where 'the two foxes' lived for many years. Terry's body lay in church at Gamlingay overnight, as was his wish, after a simple reception ceremony on Monday afternoon before friends joined with family on Tuesday morning to remember Terry with humour and affection. A ceremony will follow in Spain for those 'out there' from the other half of Terry's life he and Tom, then later Terry on his own, spent winters in Spain for health reasons. We were invited to raise a glass of 'vino Tinto' to Terry at home, after praying 'God Speed'.

JULY BENEFICE EVENTS

July 11th - Day Course on Scything and Meadow Management

Gamlingay Parish Council have unfortunately decided, in Hilary's absence, not to help fund this course, so Hilary is underwriting the cost herself to ensure it takes place. There are 6-8 places, of which three are taken, do ask round for suitable people to fill the remaining 3-5. Community volunteers are particularly sought from all the Benefice villages.

The second weekend in July is when Hilary and Norman's Ruby Wedding celebration falls. Their special family holiday has already taken place, and the family party will be on Saturday 15th July. On Sunday (16th) which is the actual anniversary, the Benefice service has been transposed from the end of the month and is held in Gamlingay to allow celebration together. The service will also celebrate all forms of family and bear in mind that sometimes people are missing, or things didn't work out as we'd hoped.


