Richard Bunyan

Richard Bunyan died in April 2020 at the height of Covid after a long illness and it is only now that a memorial service is being arranged as follows:

St Mary's Church Buckden, Saturday, 2nd September.

2pm Memorial Service and Burial of Ashes, followed by tea etc.

Richard retired in 2008, by then living in Buckden, and continued there as a retired priest, becoming less involved following his illness in 2011. Richard was appreciated by a wide number of people in the Deanery in those years and in his later days worshipped at St Neots Parish Church.
