From Hilary:

We will be celebrating Harvest this weekend, as we enter October. Our services this year will have an environmental theme alongside the more usual thanksgiving for all that we have from God, including the traditional food harvests but also much more. Please think about donating items to both decorate the churches and to provide for those we support with food provisions. Everton supports the Prebend Centre in Bedford; Gamlingay and the Hatleys support the Gamlingay Food Project (which also serves homes in Bedfordshire as it covers Potton and Everton). Donations intended to support others need to be non-perishable with, ideally, a long shelf life.

Deanery planning, which obviously includes our Benefice, has been ongoing for some time and initially was concerned with what the churches of the Deanery, individually and collectively, are doing and will do to maintain and grow their ministries. Full information and requests for help have been published in newsletters over the last 18 months with little interest being shown. The next Deanery Synod will be meeting shortly to debate a plan, with the archdeacons in attendance. The planning process has rather suddenly become more 'top down' and pressured for results, emphasizing what can be afforded in terms of paid staff. On the calculation shown this week, our parishes would need to find significantly more money to justify a full-time priest into the future. The Deanery Plan to be published shortly and before the Synod meets, has been drafted by a small planning group with the Area Dean, and is now being edited after consultation with Deanery clergy. It will be circulated to Deanery Synod representatives and contains an aspiration to involve whole PCCs in our Benefice, and possibly the neighbouring Bluebell Benefice, to work out what can be best done into the future with lower staffing levels or higher parish share. The Paxtons benefice is already in similar discussions.

This Saturday LLM ministry is being celebrated at the cathedral with a service at 2.30pm. Contact Hilary or Sandra for lifts if you would like to attend.

NEWS FROM EVERTON

Gift Day letters have been distributed and responses were already coming in this last Sunday. Huge gratitude goes to all who are contributing to this collection, which is a central element of the church's fundraising. Harvest Festival Sunday and a short period after will see the total being gathered in.

Barnabas Oley was a 17th Century cleric and academic in turbulent times, at one time vicar in Great Gransden as well as being a fellow of Clare College, Cambridge. The Trust he founded and that bears his name has a charitable purpose 'Making donations to religious and educational causes and for the relief of poverty'. Everton Church has benefitted in the past and hopes to do so again - application is being made this week.

Churchyard Wildflower areas need some hard work raking after the mulch cut which has rendered everything looking superficially better but risks preventing all but the tougher tussock grasses regenerating.

NEWS FROM GAMLINGAY

Harvest service on Sunday will celebrate the bronze level achieved in the Cambridgeshire Churchyard Conservation Award Scheme.

Produce and sale income from the service will go to the Food Project this year.

The Niassa project, to which the church has an ongoing commitment, has been supported from our Harvest in the past, and will need a separate, special initiative to raise funds this year.



The church building remains closed until CCTV is installed; John Boocock is assisting the PCC with making appropriate arrangements.

Zoom broadcast is at last working again with direct sound through the church system. We hope those at home won't have given up entirely on the broadcast services after the time this has taken. Thanks to Nick and Matt for their help with sorting this out.

Churchyard mowing regime is to be discussed at next week's Parish Council meeting - the PC has responsibility for the churchyard upkeep. Native species bulbs (bluebells and narcissus) have been obtained to populate chosen areas.
