Well done and thank you to Lynda and Sarah who produced a wonderful spread and organised a small competition and sale of produce. More help is urgently sought to make that work another year.

In Everton the church had gifts brought from school on the previous Friday, which were distributed on the Monday by Les and Dick - many thanks to all involved.

At Gamlingay the Food Project was celebrated along with everything else. Sale of produce and the Harvest Lunch incomes were set aside for the Niassa Diocese in Mozambique - total raised to be advertised next time.

LLM ministry was celebrated at the cathedral at a lovely service last Saturday. Sandra received her award on the 3rd anniversary of her first licensing, and Chris joined the service from home on YouTube - somehow his 25-year anniversary has been missed, but we are hoping to ensure it is included next year. They were both given a round of applause in church at Gamlingay the following morning as part of our 'Thank You' for the harvest of people, celebrated alongside the harvest of produce. We thank God for them and all the lay ministry that enables our churches to function in our calling to being the embodiment of the Gospel.

Volunteers have come forward so watch this space. The churchyard plan will be on display to try and ensure the correct mowing schedule is followed.

The church building remains closed for the time being. Please be patient, it will re-open when we can make it more secure.

Churchyard mowing regime is to be discussed at this week's Parish Council meeting - the PC has responsibility for the churchyard upkeep. A donation of green meadow hay (providing seeds) will be delivered - this and the native bulbs will need to be worked on in the next week or two. Do ask around and encourage volunteers if you can't help in person.

Harvest Lunch was enjoyed in the church hall by a dozen of us. Donations on the day will be added to those previously received and will support Niassa Diocese.

Memory Lane November Meeting will be a Christmas themed tea dance led by our friends from Band of Ukes.

This is the title of our new campaign – to encourage regular giving by lots of families (if they're able) to bring '2cans' to the food Hub every week.

Each of our current 20 families gets an average of 13 tins each week. That's 260 per week, 1,040 per month!! Plus, we have another 20 families we help either monthly or bi-weekly which is now easily 2,080. So, you can see how quickly we run very low of long-life items. We won't stop you bringing more than 2cans but if 150 families donate 2cans regularly you can make a HUGE difference.
