Diocesan Synod on Saturday 15th November discussed and approved:

- the budget and share requests. Shares to increase by 4 percent.
- the work of the Diocese towards the 'net zero by 2030' carbon target already agreed by the National CofE. This entails the setting up of a group with the specific task of supporting churches in working towards what is challenging work. The work in our churchyards contributes in this regard, which is encouraging. Members of Synod were invited to contribute by identifying what their parishes would most need to enable them to work in this way.

The Deanery Plan, presented at the recent Deanery Synod, acknowledges the current situation with finances, new housing in the Deanery, and available clergy. The plan includes initiating discussions in two Deanery benefices with full time clergy - i.e. the Paxtons and our parishes - concerning future staffing levels.
