At the same time, we remember with thanksgiving those in whose debt we live, whose lives have shown their commitment to their Lord in Jesus Christ in visibly special ways.

Next week we will be remembering those who have died in two World Wars, in a year when two acts of international aggression have precipitated major conflicts in Eastern Europe and the Middle East. We shall be praying for peace as we honour those who lost their lives in those two previous major conflicts, as well as in others since.

The following Sunday we will give time to remembering those who have died in this last year. At Everton this will be during the Evensong service. The service at Gamlingay has not previously been advertised and will be in addition to the morning service which will have an emphasis on wholeness and healing.
