Church Hall: We are delighted to announce completion of the remedial work to the roof of the Church Hall, and to give hugely grateful acknowledgement to Brogan Group for making this work possible. Without their providing half of the cost, this essential work could not have taken place. Making the building water-tight again will ensure that the Church Hall continues to be a valuable community asset which the Church is only able to maintain and make available with this sort of help. Brownies, Guides and the Jelly Tots Toddler Group, as well as many other occasional and regular users including Simple Lunch, will benefit from this repair.

Huge thanks to Sandra for all her efforts in both finding sources of support and organising volunteers to carry out internal refurbishments. Decoration has only been possible thanks to the grant from Julie Green and the team at Volac for which we are hugely grateful. The Church Hall refurbishment started last year when Howdens very kindly donated the kitchen and Keith Warboys fitted it for us. The kitchen flooring is to be fitted in the near future for which thanks to Jamie at Flooring Works. Most of the painting in the hall is now complete – special thanks to Ann Davis and all our amazing volunteers for their hard work.

Without the help of kind and generous donations none of this would have been possible.

The refurbishment of the hall floor is the next project and, despite generous help from Stacey at SK Flooring, will probably require more than we have in budget. Watch out in the New Year for news on the search for additional funding.

Memory Lane this week (the last one of 2023) was hugely enjoyed - despite the decimations of winter illnesses - with carols and other Christmas songs from the Community Choir. Thanks to Kate who enabled most people to make a pomander, although one or two of the oranges got eaten rather than having cloves in them! The next meeting is 23rd January 2024.
