NEWS FROM GAMLINGAY

Simple Lunch on Tuesday 20th was attended by 11 people including a grandchild, with a few regulars absent. Donations amounted to £26.60. The next one is on Tuesday 5th March.

The Churchyard had a bit of a tidy on Saturday morning - more volunteers would be very welcome. A plan for the area that used to be under the diseased beech tree, where there is now a large standing stump, will be formed in the next months. Advice on the hedge between the Hall and the churchyard will be acted on next autumn/winter, as the warm weather has brought on growth before there has been time to deal with it.

Lodge and Son (working at Everton on Friday) also take on gutter maintenance at Gamlingay and will be visiting this Friday. The roof alarm system has also had an update with change of monitoring firm.

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) is next Sunday 3rd March after the morning service and will be followed by lunch - both in the Church Hall. The Annual Report will be available in church.

Niassa: Chris Martin has shared the following very sad information...

'Some very disappointing news. The Amy Lothian school that St Mary's found the money to build in Mopoto in Niassa has closed down. 400 kids' education just gone down the pan. Reason given -no one to manage it. If you would let people know, some will be very upset.'

The church can continue to support the work of the church in Niassa province of Mozambique, unless there is a decision otherwise by the PCC. Whatever is decided we will share - our contacts work with more than the school itself, but it is the founding of the school which began the connection. Please let Hilary know your views.

Intercessions

In her February letter to clergy and ministers Bishop Dagmar has raised the issue of GDPR and intercessions. Although written with GDPR in mind, especially when the service is streamed, there are suggestions of good practice for us all. Bishop Dagmar writes:

The question has been raised about naming people with their full name in Intercessions, especially when this service is then livestreamed or otherwise made available on the internet.

Here is some advice in order not to fall foul of GDPR, but also for simply good and sensitive pastoral practice:

- 1. Always tell the individual and get their permission if you are going to name them in prayers. Clearly if they object, honour this.
- 2. Using first names only, whether streamed or otherwise, is strongly recommended.
- 3. If you wish to use full names in non-streamed services, you should still always be sure the person thus named is happy with this. Be mindful that using the full name does make the individual more identifiable, and so it is all the more important to check with them each time. First name only is certainly preferable.
- 4. **Be mindful not to add further personal information** when naming the person, such as details around health etc. This all becomes personal information linked to them and so it is always best to minimise this.

I will be contacting all those who have asked for people to be remembered on the intercession list to check that they have the permission of the person concerned (if they are too ill to give their permission then a close family member will suffice). I will also be asking whether a first name only is appropriate in each case. If you wish to add a name to the intercession list please let me know and provide me with the information from 1. and 2. above.

The intercession list will be reviewed monthly. *Chris Miller*
