



A new east window for St Denis'

This is the proposed design to replace the window lost around 60 years ago.

It is by **Aidan McRae Thomson**, a Rugby based stained glass artist – the **Friends of Friendless Churches**, the owner of this wonderful building, has commissioned him to finalise the design and make the window; installation is likely to be in 2026.

“I have,” he says, “done my best to pay homage to the style of Butterfield and Gibbs in form, colouring and layout without strictly copying any particular work.”

It was **William Butterfield** who restored the church in 1874 and **Alexander Gibbs** who made the original window – fragments are incorporated in the window on the righthand side of the chancel.
