From Hilary:

With no agreement on combining services for **Music Sunday**, there are two slightly different morning communion services this week, one in each of our parish churches at the usual times for each. The readings will be departing from the Lectionary, Chris Miller and I having chosen from options which the Royal School of Church Music has recommended to celebrate the day. Chris will be leading a rehearsal at 8.45am in Gamlingay for anyone wishing to join the choir in singing that morning. The Bible is full of music - for a start the Psalms were all songs, and it is most fitting that we have a Sunday to celebrate this most precious gift and aspect of who we are as human beings. Not everyone is 'musical' but music shapes all our lives in ways we don't always even recognise.

Thank You in the Benefice -The next variation from our regular service pattern is the last Sunday in June, which we are celebrating as a special 'Thank You' time. There will be services in all three of our churches licensed for worship. The Benefice Eucharist will be at Hatley St George; the services at the other two churches will not be Communion services and will offer social time and hospitality. We are compiling lists of people to thank, which of course includes all regular in-house people, but goes well beyond that to the many organisations and individuals with which the churches interact or are part of. Since planning the idea there has arisen at least one special 'Thank You and God Speed' at Gamlingay for which we have a visiting speaker. To check if we are forgetting anyone and to suggest inclusions, please do get in touch with Ann or Hilary. We know we won't have everyone physically present, but the services will mention as many as possible, and we will invite contributions.
