'Thank You Sunday' (there is no such liturgical calendar day, but we designated this last Sunday so in the Benefice here) saw services in all three churches which were all appreciated by those who attended. The congregation for Benefice communion at Hatley was 'small but perfectly formed' and it was really good that those who attended from elsewhere could encourage the one or two from Hatley who look for services there.

Gamlingay and Everton services were well received, both welcoming non-regulars as well as showing appreciation for people who couldn't attend but were glad to be recognised for what they do. Sandra, our second Benefice LLM, was given a good send-off at Gamlingay, as her ministry focus moves to the Paxtons. Sandra continues in our prayers and with our love. She has not moved house and will continue to be present from time to time at worship in Gamlingay.

The appreciation of the services this last Sunday suggests that this is something to include again, maybe at a similar time next year, though not necessarily as a 5th Sunday service arrangement.

Services will follow the usual pattern through the Summer. This Sunday will be an All-Age service at Gamlingay which is intended especially for families with younger members.

Public opinion on our churchyards continues to be mixed, with some vociferous disapproval from some quarters of the long grass. The volunteers helping are so much appreciated, and we look forward to more as plans are publicized. There are those out there in favour of our wildlife-friendly approach and it is so good to hear from them in support of 'doing the right thing'. Considerable time has been spent in trying to help those who are opposed to understand what is happening. This is particularly difficult at Everton, where the plans have not been put into action for lack of help to do what is intended. St Denis churchyard has historically been the best served by volunteers - thank you Nicola for organising us and Peter Mann for the mowing work. Watch out for dates for 'hay making' in all three places in the next few weeks.

This newsletter is circulated by mail each week to all on the Church Electoral Roll plus anyone else who gives their email details and requests it. It contains any news we have been given to share in our villages (Everton, Gamlingay and the Hatleys) plus news of what's going on in all three churches in the two parishes of the Benefice. Gamlingay with the Hatleys is one parish while Everton and Tetworth is the second linked parish in the current Benefice - both looked after by one parish priest.
