His Majesty the King's Official Portrait

The Cabinet Office has released a new official portrait of His Majesty the King that will soon hang in public buildings the length and breadth of the United Kingdom.

A framed copy of the portrait is being offered to public authorities across the United Kingdom free-ofcharge as part of a scheme to celebrate the new reign. This scheme has now been extended to include all Church of England churches.

The portrait, taken at Windsor Castle last year shows His Majesty wearing a Royal Navy uniform of an Admiral of the Fleet and official medals and decorations.

The Church of England is the Established Church in England, meaning that it is established by law and has a unique relationship with the State. As well as being Head of State, The King is also Supreme Governor of the Church of England.

These portraits have been acquired for all three churches in the Benefice. Thank you to Chris Miller for spotting the offer, arranging for the pictures to be delivered and supplying the above text. It will now be up to the PCCs of the Benefice to decide how and where the portraits should be displayed.

NEWS FROM EVERTON
