Arrangements for the overdue quinquennial inspection are underway – now expected to be in January.

NEWS FROM EVERTON

Soup and Social took place this Tuesday, with 21 participants and 4 helpers - not as rain-affected as at Gamlingay. The next one is on Tuesday 15th. Hilary will be able to attend the one after that on the 29th.

The PCC Meeting last Wednesday discussed and planned action on:

- **Issues with the organ** Roger Henthorne who helped construct the organ in the first place hopes to enable remedial work by Christmas.
- The church building the PCC will meet with Diocesan support (soon) and the church architect (later on) during the Autumn with a view to arranging wider information and consultation in the New Year.
- Predicted shortfall in finances at the end of the year. The possibility of reducing the number of services when the church needs heating was considered, but it was (interestingly) found to lose more than it gained, as the actual cost of heating the church is, on average, more than offset by church collections (which would be lost if there was no service).
- **The churchyard** a working party is planned for 19th October please publicise and invite participation. A work plan will be available by then.

Everton Heath Primary School has helped distribute Harvest and Gift Day information and planning is underway towards Christmas.

Harvest - the Gift Day letter has been distributed. Financial gifts will be presented at the harvest service but will, of course, also be accepted afterwards.

Harvest gifts of produce, fresh and preserved, will be donated to the SMART project at the Prebend Centre in Bedford. Help with transporting would be valued as those who have done this for many years are not able to this time.
