A recycling opportunity for electronic gadgets

A new printer for parish use is now in place at the Rectory. If you have any relevant items (computers, laptops, smartphones, printers) for recycling I will be pleased to receive them to go with the ones being collected sometime next week (two defunct printers and a couple of tablets and old mobile phones). Twenty items would mean that the £50 collection fee would be waived, so in effect that's money to go to the churches. The firm collecting will 'clean up' anything they are given, so there is no worry about giving away personal material - they do this on site before removal.

Advent continues, this Sunday, Advent 2 considering themes of Prophecy and Peace (or Joy depending on where you look for the sequence). The Old Testament prophets, and John the Baptist who is the last in that prophetic tradition, do not live in peaceful times or experience much obvious joy themselves, yet their message points beyond their time and personal experience to the Kingdom that the coming of Jesus is to establish, and for which we remember we are waiting in this Advent season.

Advent Study

The Jesse tree pictures and readings sequence continues this week with the prophets. There are many stories which could have been used in this sequence and the one telling of Elijah's confrontation with the prophets of Baal and Queen Jezebel (1 Kings 80;20-40) leads us into this week's angel. As Elijah lies in the wilderness disheartened and exhausted after his efforts he is helped to restoration by an angel, given food and rest, and is enabled to journey on, to encounter God not in the storm or the fire, but in the 'sound of sheer silence' that follows.

Monday 7.30-9pm at the Rectory in Gamlingay this last week considered what we might expect to see in meeting an angel, and what sort of Beings angels are. Do they exist outside the human imagination? In considering Jacob's dream of the ladder or stairway between earth and heaven, we were led to wonder what Jacob himself would have seen that he recognised.

This coming Monday (9th January) we transfer to the church to join in with preparations for the shared Carol Service - anyone willing to join in a gathered singing group is invited to rehearse, you do not need to read music to join in.

Wednesday 11th after the morning service at the Rectory - a meeting can take place if there are takers. This last week it will have been much curtailed, with June Simpson's funeral at Everton taking precedence for Hilary.
