Advent continues this Sunday, Advent 3 with themes of John the Baptist and Joy – click to download. John's task is similar to all the Old Testament prophets, but his lifetime overlaps and his ministry is entwined with that of Jesus himself. His task of prophecy is both the same and different, he personally recognises and greets the promised Saviour.

The angel for this week is the one who announces to Zechariah that he is to be a father when his wife Elizabeth is barren and past child-bearing age. Unlike Mary, whom we celebrate and remember next week, this announcement is met with disbelief, despite Zechariah being a priest. The result is his being struck dumb until John is born and named.

Traditional Carol Service

This Sunday we have a slightly different version of our regular Carol Service at St Mary's in Gamlingay. Rather than having two services on the same Sunday as Everton, this service is a week earlier than usual and shared with GBC, with the Carol Service at Everton the following week being the one at which the church choir will sing.

Although the choir is not 'on duty' this Sunday, there is an informal singing group singing two carols as well as joining with all the usual favourites. Rehearsals are on Sunday morning after the service (at 11am) and again just before the service in the afternoon.

The lives of John and Jesus are linked from before birth as their mothers are cousins, and meet during their pregnancies, where Mary's song, the Magnificat, comes from.
