From Hilary:

Epiphany progresses with more of Jesus' early ministry, this Sunday's Gospel recounting his reading in the synagogue of his hometown and telling his hearers that the prophecy he reads is being fulfilled in front of them.

The full revision of Church Electoral Rolls across the country takes place this year, which means a new roll is started from scratch - everyone has to re-apply. (See page 4 of this newsletter)

To meet legal requirements, announcements have to be made in churches and by other means for the two weeks before the revision takes place. Last week was the second week of the announcement for Gamlingay. Timing is determined by the date of the APCM. A PDF of the application form can be downloaded here.

Everton's APCM has been agreed for Sunday April 6th - the Everton Electoral Roll revision starts this week.

Listed Places of Worship Grants Scheme

Newsletter readers may remember being encouraged to put pressure on political representatives concerning the Listed Places of Worship Grants Scheme, which repays VAT on repair work on listed buildings in the form of a grant. Holly Robinson from the Church Buildings writes:

It has just been announced in the House of Commons Westminster Hall debate that the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme will continue for one year from March 2025 with a cap of £25k per place of worship. Furthermore, the total amount available will be capped at £23m (last year £29m was spent). https://www.gov.uk/government/news/23-million-government-package-to-support-restoration-of-thousands-of-listed-places-of-worship

This should not affect claims made during the current financial year, but we recommend you contact the LPWGS directly if you have any questions. https://listed-places-of-worship-grant.dcms.gov.uk/
This will negatively affect larger projects, and the future beyond 2026 is unknown. If you have any concerns regarding a project currently in progress, please contact me.

Holly goes on to comment:

Whilst this is disappointing news, it does at least give some certainty to projects taking place this year. I also want to thank all those who wrote to the DCMS and/or their MP. The DCMS received more than three hundred letters on the topic, and some three thousand letters were sent to MPs. One good thing is that this campaign has raised the profile of the future of our historic religious buildings. There is now a great opportunity to build positive relationships with local MPs, so they appreciate the contribution of places of worship to people, places and national heritage, so the case can be made for longer term funding as part of the next Spending Review. So please, thank your MP for their support, invite them to visit your church and share any good news stories over the coming year.

This week's material continues Epiphany, with some material for last week's story of 'water into wine' and a reminder of Jesus starting his ministry in his hometown. Next week Epiphany ends with Candlemas.

Important Notice

New Electoral Roll applications for Gamlingay and Hatley <u>must</u> be completed before 16th February by <u>all</u> who wish to be on the new Roll

In every parish there must be a church Electoral Roll on which the names of lay (i.e. not clergy) persons are entered. In accordance with the Church Representation Rules, 2025 is a year in which an entirely new Electoral Roll must be prepared in advance of the Annual Church meeting in **every parish** in the Church of England.

Under the rules notice must be given in every church in the parish not less than two months before the Annual Meeting.

Whether or not a person has their name entered on the existing Electoral Roll, anyone wishing to be enrolled on the new Roll must complete a new application.

Under Church Representation Rules no one may be elected as a lay representative to a PCC or Deanery Synod, unless his or her name is on the Electoral Roll.

Under the Church Representation Rules, a lay person is entitled to have his or her name entered on the Roll, if the person – (a) is baptised, (b) is aged 16 or over, and (c) has made one of the following three declarations and duly applied for enrolment.

- The first declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it and is resident in the parish.
- The second declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it, is not resident in the parish, but has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.
- The third declaration is that the person is a member of good standing in a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and is also a member of the Church of England and has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months

The PCC of the parish of **Gamlingay with Hatley St George and East Hatley** has set the Annual Meeting for 16 March 2025.

I would be very grateful if all of you wishing to go on the new Electoral Roll would please complete a form by **16 February 2025**. The new roll will be effective from 22 February 2025. Forms may be obtained from me or Gamlingay church.
