From Hilary:

Epiphany ends this Sunday with the feast of Candlemas. In looking for material for families, I discovered that there is a pagan festival called Imbolc - one description of it even says it's sometimes called Candlemas. However, although the pagan festival shares some of the themes i.e. those of life and light, and even purification, it does not recognise Jesus, light of the world, and can't be called Candlemas, as the name refers to a Christian feast (mass). It used to be a Sunday when the candles for the year were brought and blessed. The Sunday reading is of the visit of Jesus' parents with their firstborn son to the temple for the rite of purification - another name for the festival is 'The Presentation of Christ' and is the occasion when the Nuns Dimittis (Song of Simeon) used at Evensong appears in the Bible.

This newsletter is circulated by email each week to all on the Church Electoral Roll plus anyone else who gives their email details and requests it. It contains any news we have been given to share in our villages (Everton, Gamlingay and the Hatleys) plus news of what's going on in all three churches in the two parishes of the Benefice. Gamlingay with the Hatleys is one parish while Everton and Tetworth is the second linked parish in the current Benefice - both looked after by one parish priest.

NB: The basic information in the document below is relevant to both Parishes in the Benefice but please note that completed application forms should be returned as follows:

For Gamlingay and Hatley:

Electoral Roll Revision 2025

In every parish there must be a church Electoral Roll on which the names of lay (i.e. not clergy) persons are entered. In accordance with the Church Representation Rules, 2025 is a year in which an entirely new Electoral Roll must be prepared in advance of the Annual Church meeting in **every parish** in the Church of England.

Under the rules notice must be given in every church in the parish not less than two months before the Annual Meeting.

Whether or not a person has their name entered on the existing Electoral Roll, anyone wishing to be enrolled on the new Roll <u>must</u> complete a new application. Click here to download the application form.

Under Church Representation Rules no one may be elected as a lay representative to a PCC or Deanery Synod, unless his or her name is on the Electoral Roll.

Under the Church Representation Rules, a lay person is entitled to have his or her name entered on the Roll, if the person -(a) is baptised, (b) is aged 16 or over, and (c) has made one of the following three declarations and duly applied for enrolment.

- The first declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it and is resident in the parish.
- The second declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it, is not resident in the parish, but has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.
- The third declaration is that the person is a member of good standing in a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and is also a member of the Church of England and has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months

The PCC of the parish of **Gamlingay with Hatley St George and East Hatley** has set the Annual Meeting for 16th March 2025.

The APCM at **Everton** has been set for 6th April 2025.

Forms may be obtained from the churches or from the named Electoral Roll officers – see above.
