#### From Hilary:

For those who were in church on Sunday morning and know that some of my family were prevented from being there to sing for Norman due to a medical 'emergency' - it turned out to be a spurious blood test result (well done to our two retired GPs who spotted the likelihood straight away when they heard what had happened). All but one of the family made it to the family meal we had arranged for Norman later, and the music in church went ahead with the ad hoc choir being mainly the Benefice choir. **This Sunday 16th February** continues the countdown to Lent (3 before). It used to be called Septuagesima (70 days before Easter) with a theme of right living, including the Beatitudes which turn the world's values on their head as Jesus teaches about the values of the Kingdom of God. We may nod to Valentine's Day which is Friday 14th, as this Newsletter is circulated, although there is not much evidence for the Christian root of this celebration of human love.

Parish Share for 2025: The PCCs of both parishes will be considering a very significant rise in the parish share this year, well above the small percentage rise of the Deanery share allocation which is then subdivided between the parishes. The increase is because parishes are now being asked to cover the real cost of ministry and Gamlingay with the Hatleys and Everton parishes have a full-time priest at the moment. The only other village parishes that have this luxury are the Paxtons, where considerable efforts are being made to raise the necessary finances.

#### **PCC News**

Dorothy Jamieson (Bedfordshire and Cambs local historian) is helping to work on a Churches Trail to go with the Greensand Ridge Walk, a spin-off from the History Event which launched the community consultation now ongoing. Responses will be collected throughout the next month. The PCC is supported by Samuel Pedlar in analysing the survey he helped to produce.

The Survey (attached last week) takes you to on-line, or hard copy which can be printed and returned to Everton church or any of the PCC. It asks about the use of the church and is for everyone who has any connection, whether they live in Everton parish or not. As such, anyone in Gamlingay with Hatleys parish is most welcome to respond, as we are 'in it together' as a Benefice in terms of the use of our church buildings.

The PCC and other church members will be pleased to learn that a cheque from the Barnabas Oley fund for a grant of £1,500, awarded towards the end of last year, has arrived at the Rectory and will be heading for the church bank account shortly.

This newsletter is circulated by email each week to all on the Church Electoral Roll plus anyone else who gives their email details and requests it. It contains any news we have been given to share in our villages (Everton, Gamlingay and the Hatleys) plus news of what's going on in all three churches in the two parishes of the Benefice. Gamlingay with the Hatleys is one parish while Everton and Tetworth is the second linked parish in the current Benefice - both looked after by one parish priest.

NB: The basic information in the document below is relevant to both Parishes in the Benefice but please note that completed application forms should be returned as follows:

#### For Gamlingay and Hatley:

#### **Electoral Roll Revision 2025**

In every parish there must be a church Electoral Roll on which the names of lay (i.e. not clergy) persons are entered. In accordance with the Church Representation Rules, 2025 is a year in which an entirely new Electoral Roll must be prepared in advance of the Annual Church meeting in **every parish** in the Church of England.

Under the rules notice must be given in every church in the parish not less than two months before the Annual Meeting.

Whether or not a person has their name entered on the existing Electoral Roll, anyone wishing to be enrolled on the new Roll must complete a new application.

Under Church Representation Rules no one may be elected as a lay representative to a PCC or Deanery Synod, unless his or her name is on the Electoral Roll.

Under the Church Representation Rules, a lay person is entitled to have his or her name entered on the Roll, if the person – (a) is baptised, (b) is aged 16 or over, and (c) has made one of the following three declarations and duly applied for enrolment.

- The first declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it and is resident in the parish.
- The second declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it, is not resident in the parish, but has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.
- The third declaration is that the person is a member of good standing in a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and is also a member of the Church of England and has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months

The PCC of the parish of **Gamlingay with Hatley St George and East Hatley** has set the Annual Meeting for 16<sup>th</sup> March 2025.

The APCM at Everton has been set for 6<sup>th</sup> April 2025.

Forms may be obtained from the churches or from the named Electoral Roll officers – see above.
